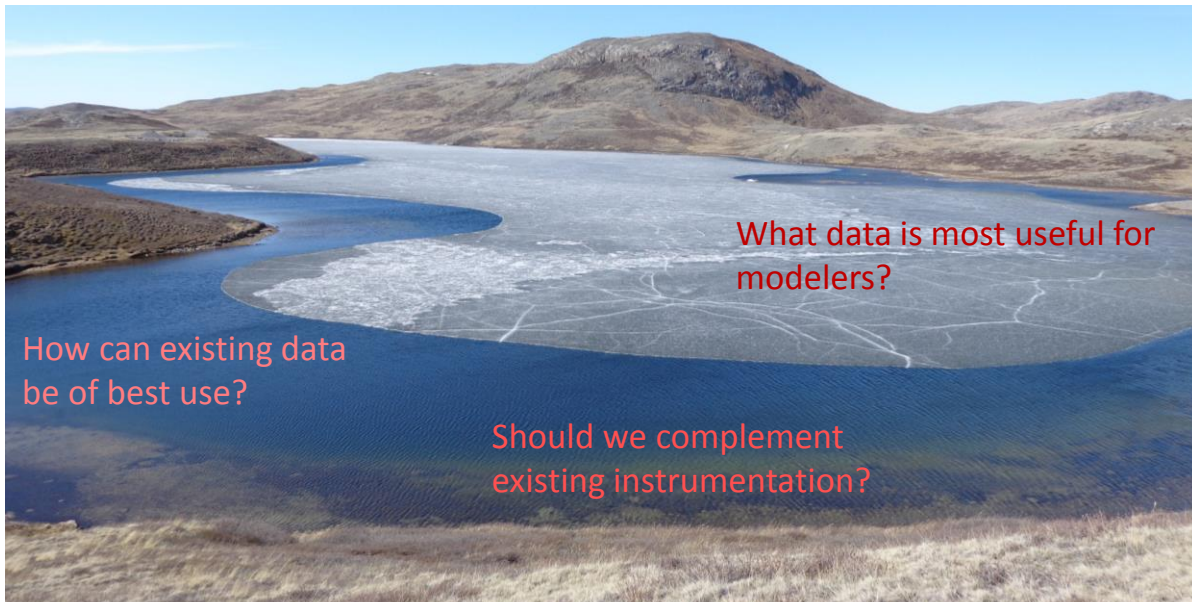


Presentation and discussion about new field resource at Greenland

April 26, 10.00 -12.00 in the Tarfala room (T40) at NG

Since 2010, SKB has conducted (mainly) hydrologic and biogeochemical research at the Two-Boat-Lake (TBL) site in western Greenland within the framework of the Greenland Analogue Surface Project (GRASP). The most intensive period of investigations is now finalized and SKB will not start any new larger field studies on their own but are willingly to support future research driven by research groups outside of SKB. Specifically, the existing monitoring installations and field lab equipment will be left in TBL given that future investigations will be run and maintained by researchers at SU (Ylva Sjöberg at NG). All data collected up to date (including weather parameters, hydrological data, ground temperatures and more) is freely available and constitutes an excellent platform for future work.

At this meeting we want to invite more researchers – across the Bolin Center disciplines – to make use of the site and its data. We will present the site infrastructure, collected data and studies. We want to start a discussion on how the site can be of best use and developed into a valuable resource for as many researchers as possible.
